April

This month we celebrate April with our **40th Exhibition of Fine Woodworking** at the <u>Corvallis Library</u>. MWWG membership is at a record high so we expect many new exhibitors and another outstanding show. Here is what you need to know.

Each member is eligible to submit up to three works that have not been shown at an MWWG event in the past (except if displayed at Footwise in March). If you haven't done so already, promptly email the following information about each entry to Kurt at <u>kurt@mottweilerstudio.com</u> (even if you are unsure of whether an item will be finished in time). We will use the information you provide to print a display card for your piece. The entry deadline is **Monday, April 22.**

Mandatory: Your name and a title or brief description of the piece. Optionally you can add the materials used. For example:

Mark Jones, Arts and Crafts side table, fumed oak. Mary Jones, inlayed tea box with silver inlay

Optional: Instructions for viewers. For example:

"Please don't touch." "OK to open the drawers." "It's a chair! Please sit!"

Optional:Whether you would like a QR code added to the display card to direct visitors to your website.

Bring your entry to the Corvallis Public Library Community Room on **Wednesday, April 24, between Noon and 2:30**. Please stay awhile to help us set up the room to display your work.

At least one of us needs to be present during <u>Library hours</u> to host visitors, answer questions, and maintain a visitor count during each shift. Hosting shifts are 2-hours, so contact Tim Emery at <u>timanna.emery@gmail.com</u> to reserve a spot.

We will have ballots to ask visitor to vote for their favorite pieces. We will use their votes to award "People's Choice" prizes, contributed by local businesses, to makers of the three most popular works. Several members are contributing their own awards and if you'd like to offer one, too, contact Del Banners at <u>delbanners@icloud.com</u> for arrangements. After the People's Choice prizes are awarded, additional prizes will be raffled off at no charge to members with work in the Exhibition. Prizes will be awarded on Sunday, April 28, at 2:30.

Please come to our "Meet the Artists" evening from 6:00-8:00 PM (beyond normal library closing) on Friday, April 26 to meet visitors and answer questions about your work. MWWG will provide some refreshments but you have a simple mess-less snack to bring, all the better.

The Exhibition ends at noon on Sunday, April 28 and all pieces must be removed by 3:00 pm.

Thanks to everyone who makes this event happen and to all of our members who contribute their best work for all to see.
