- General size & whether it is best displayed on a table, a pedestal, or floor

I started working with wood at a young age, building forts in my parents back yard. As a teenager with no clear view of my future I lucked into a carpentry apprenticeship and then spent the rest of my working career as a carpenter then contractor. I would build furniture for my own home or as gifts for friends and family but never had time for serious woodworking until I retired in 2017. That was also the



year that I joined the Mid-Willamette Valley Woodworkers Guild and found so many other wood enthusiasts. My projects now often include encaustic wax paint to add artistic details to my pieces. Occasionally I

take take commissioned work but mostly I just get an idea in my head and start sketching and building. The Wedding Dance sculpture is made of purpleheart and maple woods with French polished shellac finish. It stands 24" tall and 6" wide.

Wood

<u>The Hardwood Centre</u>. Big supporters of MWWG and nice folks. Hardwoods, birch plywood, some veneers, and locally milled lumber. Also a pick up site for Bam Carbide tooling. They are happy to order what they don't have.

<u>Crosscut in Eugene and Portland</u>. If the Hardwood Centre doesn't have it these folks have a larger selection and stock. MWWG members get a discount at the Eugene store so let them know you are one of us!

<u>Lewis Judy/Northwest Timber</u>. Also a long time supporter of MWWG. If you are looking for highly figured woods from the Pacific Northwest for a special project, try here first.

<u>Tree Products Eugene</u>. A good source for hardwood, veneered plywood and more.
