someone making sure everything is covered, especially the essentials: getting the word out, staffing the show, set up and close up.

Elephant no. 3: Besides officers, the Guild's board often has one or more at large members and we could always use more. While at large members do not have specified responsibilities, as voting board members they steer the future of the guild as its board decides on meeting programs, plans other events and works to meet its organizational challenges. I was an at large member for over 2 years before volunteering to be president. During that time I attended most of the Guild's general and board meetings, learned more about how the Guild functions and offered any ideas and opinions that I thought could be helpful either at board meetings or via email. It wasn't a big time commitment but I was happy to help keep the Guild going.

October Meeting Recap: A Night of Craft and Connection


at the Woodworkers Guild

The October Mid-Willamette Woodworkers
Guild meeting at Wade Hardware brought
together enthusiasts of all skill levels to
explore the art and soul of woodturning. The
three speakers, Michael, Sam, and Gary,
focused on the tactile, technical, and
philosophical aspects of working with wood,
offering attendees a well-rounded experience
of the craft.

One of the central themes of the gathering was the sensory experience of turning wood. Attendees discussed how different wood species offer unique textures and resistance, with each type presenting its own personality.

Beyond technique, the meeting emphasized the journey of woodworking as a deeply personal and even spiritual pursuit. The rhythmic hum of the lathe and the transformation of raw material into something meaningful were described as magical moments that transcend mere craftsmanship.

Safety was also a key focus of the evening. Presenters stressed the importance of proper

The guild itself serves as a valuable resource, offering mentorship and community for those eager to grow their skills and deepen their appreciation for woodworking.
